Course Objectives

- 1. Introduce the Student to Agricultural Law
- 2. To encourage the student's analysis of legal issues and concepts as applied to agriculture
- 3. To generate critical thinking in matters related to agricultural production, natural resources, and environmental policy
- 4. To provide students with practical information that can be used personally and professionally

Attendance
